Picture: City of Tshwane/Twitter. A wage dispute between SARS and PSA will see workers embark on strike action this week. PSA assistant general manager Reuben Maleka says SARS workers will stage a "lunchtime picket" at the revenue service offices on Monday and Tuesday. He says demonstrations will escalate to a "full-blown strike" on Wednesday if an agreement has not been reached with the employer. The strike action is expected to affect SARS offices nationwide and various ports of entry. PSA leadership met with SARS officials over the weekend to break deadlocked wage talks. The association is asking SARS for an increase of 7% plus CPI. According to Maleka, SARS has made an offer of R500 million towards providing wage increases. He says the union partner must first calculate what that would amount to for each worker. "We need to quantify that money into a percentage so that we can go back to members," Maleka tells CapeTalk. He says employees are battling with the rising cost of living as the price of basic services, food, fuel, and electricity continues to increase. Today's strike is at
