The Public Servants' Association in Limpopo says the ruling by the Constitutional Court which declared the 2018 public sector wage agreement invalid and unlawful, will negatively affect about 20 000 of its public servants in the province. Unions in the public sector who include the National Education, Health and Allied Workers Union, have suffered another blow after the ConCourt dismissed their application to have government ordered to pay workers wage increases as per the collective bargaining agreement. PSA Limpopo provincial manager John Teffo says the state negotiated in bad faith knowing that the wage increase was not budgeted for from the beginning. The PSA has written to the Public Sector Co-ordinating Bargaining Council for an opportunity to re-table the demands stated in the 2018 wage agreement. Teffo says these demands are still valid....
