PSA Limpopo concerned about marking centre COVID-19 cases 2021-Dec-20 04:21 The Public Servants Association (PSA) in Limpopo wants the Department of Basic Education to ensure that COVID-19 protocols are implemented at Grade 12 examination papers marking centers. - Mpho Galetshitse The Public Servants Association (PSA) in Limpopo wants the Department of Basic Education to ensure that COVID-19 protocols are implemented at Grade 12 examination papers marking centers. This after 23 markers tested positive for COVID-19 in the province. PSA Limpopo spokesperson, John Teffo, said the marking of Grade 12 scripts is important, but should not happen at the expense of employees. The PSA also called on the department to ensure that there is efficient contact tracing, reporting of cases to both the departments of Health, Labour and Employment, and that decontamination is done in affected workplaces to contain the spread of the virus. "The PSA established that despite this high number of positive cases, those who were in contact with the infected persons have not been isolated or subjected to rapid testing to determine their status. The delay in delivering scripts to markers prolonged the time spent together by markers, increasing the chances of infection," said Teffo. The workers' union accused the Department of Education if failing to ensure that markers are working in a conducive environment and added that the department did not act promptly once it was aware of the increased number of positive COVID-19 cases. Teffo claimed that in some centres cases are kept a secret and markers would not know whether their colleagues tested positive or left the marking centre for personal reasons....
