

MEDIA RELEASE: PSA shocked by "wrong" appointments at Limpopo Department of Health

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The Public Servants Association of South Africa (PSA) is shocked by the statement by Limpopo Department of Health MEC, Dr Phophi Ramathuba, that employees' salaries take the biggest slice of the budget because there are "wrong people" on the establishment.

"The MEC's shocking admission that there are many people on the system who often seek outside input to execute their duties requires an urgent independent forensic investigation and serious action must be taken to rectify the situation. The repercussions of flawed recruitment processes and 'job for pals' schemes must be investigated independently and those responsible be held accountable. The Department is already severely compromised by a shortage of health professionals in hospitals and clinics while people who cannot perform their duties remain on the payroll at taxpayers' expense," said PSA Provincial Manager in Limpopo, John Teffo.

The PSA pointed out that the dire shortage of health professionals in the province is worsened by the fact that the Department will not be absorbing health professionals who are completing their community service. The majority of health professionals are already leaving the province owing to the threat of unemployment or retrenchment as result of their non-absorption.

"The irrational decision not to absorb health professionals will not only affect employees but also communities who will not have access to sufficient public health services. Inadequate employment of qualified health professionals has resulted into excessive overtime performed by a minimal number of staff. Urgent measures are needed to employ more health professionals to prevent a disastrous, total collapse of the Limpopo health system," warned Mr Teffo.

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
