Update: Various Eastern Cape Departments hit by COVID-19 Second Wave

The PSA previously warned its members of the COVID-19 second wave and advised its members to be cautious and vigilant of COVID-19. The second wave is hitting the province hard recently as the PSA received a number of reports in the following areas affected the with COVID-19 infection:

- SASSA in Qumbu closed after a confirmed case and fumigation was done. Employees are expected to return to work on 7 December 2020
- Gateway Hospital in Mthatha closed after 10 of its employees tested positive
- The PSA sadly lost a member at the Department of Transport, members are receiving counselling from the wellness team.
- Ncapayi JS in Butterworth is temporarily closed following COVID-19 infection affecting teachers

The report given above is a clear indication that the COVID-19 second wave is back and COVID-19 protocols should not be ignored. The PSA appreciates the immediate response by the affected departments to close the Offices, allow members to self-isolation and further fumigate the affected areas. The PSA appeals to its members to be vigilant and cautiously follow all the COVID-19 protocols. The PSA is in the process of writing to the Office of the Premier to consider allowing all departments to work on a rotational basis to avoid employee mass infections.
