## **Response to COVID-19**

The employer presented a report on their response to Covid-19. According to the employer's report managers are encouraged to let employees physically come into the office as little as possible. The employer further reported that most employees work remotely and only report to the office if they need to print or attend to functions that cannot be done remotely. The employer reported that they created an isolation room for emergency situations and is in the process to equip the room with the required equipment.
