## Update: COVID-19 vaccination roll-out plan - Department of Social Development

During a special Council meeting on 19 July 2021, the employer tabled a roll-out plan for the Department of Social Development for consultation purposes on the vaccination portfolio for eligible employees in the Department.

The Department of Social Development (DSD) engaged the Department of Health from February 2021 to prioritise the DSD portfolio for vaccination during phase 1 and again during phase two of the vaccination program. The DSD only received confirmation from the Department of Health in July and certain occupational groups were identified to be prioritised as eligible in relation to the work they perform, e.g., frontline staff. The following categories were identified:

- Early-Childhood Development (ECD) workforce Educators looking after children at ECD centres, which remain open during the current lockdown alert level and are thus at risk similar to school teachers are.
- **Group B Social Service Professions** Social workers who provide psychosocial support to citizens affected and infected by COVID-19 as well as other social illnesses. Inclusive of private sector.
- Group C National and Provincial Staff, inclusive of Cleaning and Security staff All frontline staff members who are in direct contact with members of the public through registration, monitoring and evaluation, processing of child protection register applications, etc.
- **Group D SASSA Staff** All frontline staff dealing with grant applications, home visitations to assist the elderly, persons with disabilities, etc.,
- Group E National Development Agency all on the database Employees who are in direct contact with the public, collecting applications daily for consideration of grant funding for projects and includes a cohort of people who assist in SASSA queues.

The DSD in its submission also indicated that its preference is for a single-dose vaccine (J&J), if possible and feasible. It also indicated that transport will be provided by Provincial Departments to assist employees who need to visit different vaccination sites. The roll-out plan commenced on 19 July and will be closely monitored. Regular feedback will be provided. The DSD already registered most of the eligible employees on the EVDS system and the vaccine sites have been identified per province (attached).

The Department of Health has confirmed the initial vaccination sites for the DSD Cluster. Based on the ongoing analysis of the vaccination site capacity and stock levels against the demand of the workforce, it may add additional sites. The PSA applauds the DSD for this initiative.

Members are encouraged to make use of this opportunity, whilst emphasising that this is a voluntary choice.

- The DSD engaged with DoH from February 2021 on prioritizing the DSD Portfolio/ Portfolio for vaccination during phase 1 and again during phase 2 of the vaccination programme – against the context of the work we are doing as the Portfolio i.e. frontline staff.
- Confirmation from DOH has been received in this regard during the current phase.

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## Principles / Success Factors/Lessons Learnt -1

- Availability of Credible data for final consideration by DoH;
- Use of existing sites (used by DBE and current sites countrywide);
- Preference is for single-dose vaccines; (J&J) where possible and feasible
- Transportation provided by Provinces Departments + SASSA + NDA for their staff.
   (NB: DoH's role is purely to ensure vaccination any other matter is borne to the DSD Portfolio);
- POPIA and Privacy measures have been considered in line with DSD privacy policies/regulations;
- Allocation of DSD site vaccination contact persons/ x2 per site; (Entire/Portfolio);
- Communication matters to be coordinated across the sector; (key messages, media briefing, comms to staff etc.);
- Development of daily monitoring tool (dashboards etc.) and availability of District Heads to trouble-shoot challenges;
- Urgent MinMec TBC to brief MECs on progress.

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#### Principles / Success Factors/Lessons Learnt -2

- Allocation and deployment of vaccination site contact persons/ x2 per site;
   (Entire\ Portfolio); to manager operations
- Communication matters to be coordinated across the sector; (key messages, media briefing, comms to staff etc.);
- Consultation with all stakeholders and sharing of information for planning purposes
- Vaccination Hesitancy to have key messages in the communication plan to counter misinformation about vaccine
- Establishment of PMOs at the lowest level possible enable easy coordination and troubleshooting of challenges
- Development of daily monitoring tool (dashboards etc.) and availability of District Heads to trouble-shoot challenges; - progress reports on daily vaccination uptake/turn-up of officials
- Briefing of political principals on progress.

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## Status Update: 14 July 2021

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#### Important engagements: Establishment of project structures

- Developed a national project plan to guide the implementation.
- Held several meetings with DOH (Dr Crisp and Prof. Ian) and team to initiate the planning process and these are ongoing on a daily basis.
- Had a meeting with HOD's and CEO's on the 07 July 2021 where they identified their Provincial leads and consistently updated them on progress.
- Established an extended PMO where we meet daily with provinces and entities to provide guidance and track progress (held 8 meetings already) and we are taking lessons from the DBE process
- Provinces have engaged with their districts for collection of data and completion of their VR plans.
- Presented to the National Communicators Forum on the 10 July 2021 to explain the process and enable them to develop their communication plan

#### DSD Portfolio Officials who are not on the EVDS database

- If a DSD Portfolio workforce is not on the EVDS the affected individual must notify their local office manager who will verify the information and update the district and provincial database;
- The province will submit the name and details to National DSD Project Management Office;
- The National DSD project management office will then facilitate the updating of the information on the EVDS system of the Department of Health;
- The Department of Social Development will then notify the Province once the EVDS system has been updated for purposes of further communication to the District and Local office.

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## Next critical steps for state of readiness

- DOH has confirmed the vaccination sites and the state of readiness to start on the 19 -23 July 2021 with DSD Portfolio.
  - Provinces have mobilised their local offices and have worked on how their staff would go over a three day period to be vaccinated.
  - They are also working on their transport plans
- The ECD sector that is not included in the ECD stimulus have collected names of workforce which have been provided to DOH.
  - The ECD sector once the dates are announced would make their own arrangements to get to vaccination sites
- An urgent MINMEC should be convened to bring MEC's on board
- A media briefing to the sector by Thursday the 15<sup>th</sup> July 2021 to release information on the vaccination rollout programme
- The communication targeting officials in the Portfolio as well as to the ECD and SSP's in the NGO sector should continue before and throughout the process
