What is happening in SARS

2021 Wage Negotiations

Members were previously informed that the PSA approached the High Court to force the employer to comply with the final leg of the wage agreement that was signed in 2019. This happened after the employer failed to implement the 6.2% salary increase as per the multi year agreement although the employer implemented 3.9% after various discussions. The PSA at the time appreciated the show of goodwill but maintained that the full 6.2% salary increase must be paid.

INFORMUS

The PSA can now confirm that all the required court documents including the various affidavits has now been submitted to the High Court. The PSA's attorneys will engage the registrar of the High Court and ensure that the matter is set down to be argued before the court. We are hopeful that the matter will be set down to be argued soon.

Members must not confuse the 2021 wage negotiations update with the 2022 wage negotiations where parties deadlocked and the PSA issued the Notice to embark on Industrial Action. Members are urged to ensure full participation in the coming strike to force the employer to come to the party as this is the only language that the employer understands. The fight for the rights and interests of the workers remains a priority for the PSA.
