Freedom of Association

Section 23 of the *Constitution of the Republic of South Africa* protects employees' right to form and join a trade union and participate in its activities and programs. The protection is further expressed in sections 4 and 5 of the *Labour Relations Act, 66 of 1995 (LRA)*, which also prohibits anyone from discriminating against employees who exercise their freedom of association. Any employee regardless of their position or rank may join a trade union and benefit from the protection it provides in ensuring that fair labour practices are observed in the workplace. The more employees associate to the same union the stronger that union becomes and will be effective in promoting its members' interests and protecting their rights. The union which represents the majority of employees in the workplace will be able to obtain all organisational rights contained in the *LRA* and will negotiate salaries and benefits for its members. Employers are not allowed to intimidate employees or threaten them when they join a trade union as this will be a breach of section 5 of the *LRA*. Acts of intimidation and threats should be reported to the union immediately.
