Update: 2021-wage dispute and High Court judgement

Members will recall that a task team was established to discuss the High Court judgement that ruled in favour of the PSA and members to have the outstanding 2.3% salary increase of 2021 implemented. The task team met and during the consultation session the employer informed labour that it has not received any additional funding from National Treasury to implement the judgement and that at the current state, it does not have the required funding to implement the judgement. The employer presented labour with various options/proposals on what it could afford. These options will be discussed with members during the upcoming *WebEx* meetings that are arranged for next week on Tuesday and Wednesday.

Members must know that the PSA has not taken a stance on the proposals and that the proposals will be presented to members after the *WebEx* meeting for a decision to be made on the way forward. The PSA requests members to be patient until the meetings to have a full understanding of the options and the implications that will stem from these. A mandate process will also follow the *WebEx* meetings.

Members will be informed of developments.
